East Ferris Fire and Emergency Services (EFFES) hosted a live fire training session with participation from multiple municipal fire departments—an important exercise in preparedness and collaboration. Throughout the year, we held many successful community events, including the 10th Annual Tradeshaw, which continues to showcase our vibrant local businesses and organizations.

Thank you for being part of our community. We look forward to another year of connection, growth, and celebration.

### Blue Box Transition Program

The East Ferris Residential Recycling Program is now managed by Circular Materials.

### Be Recycle Ready

- Give containers a quick rinse before putting in your recycling.
- Place materials clean, dry and loose in your recycling.
- Flatten and bundle cardboard to save space.
- Lids and labels can remain on containers.
- Have your recycling to the curb by 6 a.m. on collection day.
- Hazardous materials, like batteries and medical sharps, do not belong in your recycling. Safely recycle them at a designated drop off location.

# Municipal Election



2026 is a municipal election year in Ontario, with Election Day set for Monday, October 26, 2026. This is your chance to help shape the future of our community by voting for your local council and school board representatives. Residents are reminded to make sure they are registered to vote—visit Elections Ontario. Election updates and key details will be shared on our municipal website and Facebook page. Important dates and deadlines can also be found throughout this calendar.

**Candidacy:** Eligible candidates for municipal elections must be:

- A Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old;
- A resident of the municipality, a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such non-resident owner or tenant; and
- Not legally prohibited from voting; and not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office.
- Candidates are also required to pay a fee of \$100 (\$200 for head of council) and submit 25 endorsement signatures with their nomination.

**Nomination Day:** Nomination period opens on Friday, May 1st, 2026. Nominations are due to the Clerk by 2:00 p.m. on Friday, August 21st, 2026..

**Voting Day:** Monday, October 26th, 2026. Voting locations are open from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Voting locations will be determined by the Clerk.

**Advance Polls:** Dates, times and locations of Advance Polls will be posted on the Municipal website and Facebook at least 16 days before polling day.

# Taxes & Assessment



## Important Notes!

- Interim tax bills will be mailed out in January 2026 - Installments are due on February 27th & March 31st, 2026
- Final tax bills will be mailed in May 2026 - Installments are due on June 30th & July 31st, 2026

## Payment Methods

### • PRE-AUTHORIZED TAX PAYMENT PLAN

The Municipality of East Ferris offers four convenient pre-authorized payment plan options:

- #1. Monthly on the 1st or 15th of each month: annual taxes are withdrawn over 12 months, from January to December.
- #2. Bi-Monthly on the 1st and 15th of each month: annual taxes are withdrawn twice per month over 12 months, from January to December.
- #3. Installment due dates: annual taxes are withdrawn on the due dates as per the tax bill.
- #4. Arrears: 12 monthly withdrawals on the 1st or 15th of each month - subject to penalty and interest on any balance outstanding.

Note: plan options #1, #2 and #3 are available to those ratepayers with no outstanding tax arrears.

- BY MAIL (cheque or money order)
- AT THE MUNICIPAL OFFICE (cheque, cash or Interac)
- INTERNET/TELEPHONE BANKING

Payments can be made using personal online internet/telephone banking. Six (6) digits of your nineteen (19) digit roll number are required to process your payment. i.e. 4834-0000-01-23466-0000).

## Name/Mailing Address Changes to Accounts

The Municipality of East Ferris does not have the legal authority to amend the assessment roll without authorization from the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC). Legal documentation for changes/additions/deletions of names is required. Mailing address change forms are available at the Municipal Office or on our website.

## Assessment Appeals

If you disagree with MPAC's assessment or classification of your property, you can file a Request for Reconsideration, free of charge. Your deadline to file a Request for Reconsideration with MPAC is printed on your Property Assessment Notice. For further information on the changes related to assessment appeals, please visit [www.mpac.ca](http://www.mpac.ca). In the event that you have filed an assessment appeal or a Request for Reconsideration, the Municipality of East Ferris must await notification by the Assessment Review Board or the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation before your appeal can be processed.

# Burning



## Fire Size

Up to 1m x 1m	No Permit Required
1m x 1m – 1.8 x 1.8m	Permit Required
Over 1.8m x 1.8m	Site inspection and Special Permit Required

## Frequently Asked Questions

1. Campfires don't need a permit under 1m x 1m in size
2. Burn clean untreated wood
3. Daytime cooking fires only permitted in a registered campground with permission from camp owner
4. You must stay with your fire
5. No burning till after 6:00 p.m.
6. No Burning during high winds
7. No burning garbage or treated wood

Absolutely no daytime burning from April 1st – October 31st of any year.

Anyone not following the rules set by municipal Council could be fined up to \$500.00 and invoiced for the cost of extinguishment.

## Beach Areas

The Municipality has two official beach/swimming locations. Please note that dogs are not allowed in beach areas and must be on a leash in Municipal parks. Beach areas are monitored by the North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit for water quality for swimming.

**Big Moose Beach-** 60 Big Moose Road, Corbeil:

The park is located beside the Government Dock and boat launch. The park has a picnic shelter with picnic tables, grassed areas, and sandy beach. A portable washroom is onsite

**Centennial Beach -** 543 Centennial Crescent, Corbeil:

This beach is available for public use and includes a small park area and picnic table.

## Municipal Boat Launches

The community has three boat access points to enjoy a day on the lake. Docks associated with launch areas are installed by the Victoria Day weekend in May and are removed after the Thanksgiving weekend in October. Please respect parking areas when using the launches and keep the access to the launch area open.

# Garbage Collection



**Don't be Late:** Waste must be placed at the end of the driveway by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.

**Keep the Weight Down:** Items that are too heavy will not be collected. By-law 2013-15 describes weight limits.

**Bag Limit:** There is a weekly 3 bag limit for household curbside collection. All bags **MUST** be in a container with a lid.

**Avoid Accidents:** Wrap broken glass and sharp objects in a puncture resistant package.

**Household Waste Only:** Only household waste will be collected. Household waste includes, but is not limited to, non-recyclable items like food scraps and packaging.

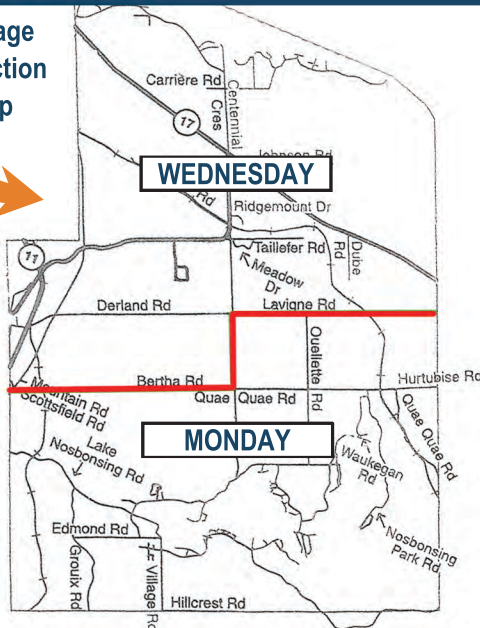

# Fire Safety



## Properly Installed and Maintained Smoke Alarms Save Lives

### Preventing Outdoor Fires

Never park your car or truck over a pile of leaves. The heat from the vehicle's catalytic converter or exhaust system can ignite the leaves below. The resulting fire could destroy your vehicle.

Contact your utility company if trees or branches are not clear of power lines. Prune back trees, and rake up leaves and debris. If you live in an open area with a lot of natural vegetation, consider creating a defensible fire zone around your home. Prune the bottom branches from trees and remove shrubs and trees within 20 feet of your home.

### Heating your Home

#### Central Heating

- Get your central heating system cleaned, inspected and serviced by a certified heating, venting and air conditioning contractor every year before using it.
- If you have a gas heater, make sure that you have a sufficient quantity of fully functioning CO alarms installed in your home.
- Keep all flammable materials away from your furnace. This includes, clothing, paint products, toxic materials, cardboard and more.

#### Fireplaces and Woodstoves

- Have heating appliances serviced and chimney flues examined for defects.
- Have fireplaces and fireplace dampers checked.
- Fireplaces should be equipped with an appropriate screen or glass enclosure to prevent sparks from flying out.
- Wood burning stoves should be examined and the flue and chimney checked for creosote build-up.
- Use only seasoned woods, and avoid soft woods like pine, etc.
- Never use a flammable liquid to start a fireplace.
- Never overload the hearth with wood or artificial logs, the resulting fire may be too large for the unit.
- Put all ashes outdoors and away from the house in a metal container.

#### Space Heaters

- Make sure that any space heaters are surrounded by at least three feet of empty space.
- Never place clothing or any other objects on a space heater to dry.
- Do not place space heaters near furniture or drapery.
- Turn space heaters off when you leave the house or go to bed.
- Avoid storing any combustible items near heaters.

# Planning & Building



Are you thinking of renovating or constructing a new garage or home next year?

Come in to talk to the Planning and Building Departments now to begin discussing your plans to get a head start on the busy construction season. Your plans may require additional processes, so plan ahead.

The Planning Department reviews the following proposals:

- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Official Plan
- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Zoning By-law
- Applications for a Plan of Subdivision and Subdivision Agreement(s)
- Shore Road Allowance inquiries/purchases
- Applications for Minor Variance
- Applications for Consent to Sever
- Applications for Site Plan Control
- Other Land Use Matters

The building review will consider:

- Requirements of the building permit
- Standards of the Ontario Building Code
- Compliance with NBMCA regulations



A Building Permit IS REQUIRED for the following:

- A structure with an area of 107 square feet or greater, consisting of a wall, roof and/or floor, and/or includes plumbing, fixtures, and services systems appurtenant thereto
- A detached shed 161 square feet or over
- A deck
- Projects where plumbing fixtures are added or relocated
- Demolishing a building
- Replacing shingles
- A pool
- A fence
- Installation of roof-mounted solar panels
- Constructing a new home/cottage or garage
- Major renovation projects

A Building Permit is NOT REQUIRED for the following:

- Landscaping, sidewalks, driveways
- Painting and decorating
- New flooring (tile, carpet etc...)
- Installation of kitchen cabinets (not including plumbing fixtures)
- Replacing doors (in existing openings)
- Installation of new windows (in existing openings)
- Re-painting brick veneer or chimney brick
- Replacing deteriorated wood for verandah floors or steps
- Installation of air conditioners or heat pumps
- Garden or tool sheds under 160 ft 2/15 m2

Also, to keep your system running efficiently, have your septic system pumped out on a regular basis. You can pick up water bottles at the Municipal Office to test your well water.
